A Christian Resolution Romans 12:1-2

I. What is a Resolution?

- a. The determination to do, or not do, something
 - i. The shepherds Lk 2:15
 - ii. Jesus Lk 9:51 cf. v. 53
 - iii. Instructions to Joshua Josh 1:7-8
- b. Usage in law expressing legislative will or purpose "whereas . . . be it resolved" (The pattern seen in Romans)
- c. In popular usage: "what I hope to accomplish"
 Frequently with little resolve and broken promises.
- d. In our text: exhortation to be resolute

II. St. Paul's Exhortation Rom 12:1-2

- a. "I appeal to you" *cf.* Moffatt; Goodspeed translations Lexical: "to implore" also "to summon"
- b. On the basis of God's mercy (expounded in Rom 1-8; 9-11) God's mercy is our motivation to be consecrated to him.
- c. "Present your **bodies**" cf. I Cor 6:20 (We follow Jesus, not Plato)
- d. "A living sacrifice" You, not dead animals
 - i. Holy & acceptable to God (without blemish cf. Eph 5:25-27)
 - ii. This is proper worship

Sunday sets the pattern; it isn't a substitute

- e. Contrasted to "this world" the customs of this world v. 2
 - i. Christians are called to a distinctive life "bought with a price"
 - ii. Change begins in our minds v. 2b
 - iii. One will of God "good, pleasing and complete"

III. Important Supporting Passages Gal 6:12-16; Eph 4:1ff

- a. Do not be led astray by obsolete distinctions Gal 6:12-13
- b. Coming to the cross sanctifies us to Jesus the Lord Gal 6:14
- c. The partition between Jew & Gentile is abolished in Jesus $\it cf$. Eph 2:13-22
- d. Therefore, live in a way that is worthy of Jesus Eph 4:1; 5:25, 22

All this we should be resolved anew to do in the Year of our Lord 2021.
